Appliance Safety Recommendations

- Follow manufacturer's instructions for installation and maintenance of natural gas appliances.
- Contact a certified natural gas appliance contractor:
 - o To perform routine maintenance on appliances to keep them clean and in proper working order.
 - o If a natural gas flame is not blue.
 - o If a pilot light will not light.
 - o If you need to move your natural gas appliances.
- Clean or change filters on furnaces and dryers regularly.
- Keep the stove clean and free of dirt and grease.
- Match the size of the natural gas flame or heating element to the pan size when cooking on the stove.

- When lighting a flame, always strike the match first, then turn on the natural gas.
- Keep flammable items like paint, solvents, cloth and paper away from natural gas appliances.
- Provide proper ventilation in areas around furnaces, water heaters, dryers and stoves, etc.
- Make sure all vents and chimneys are clean and working properly.
- Recognize the natural gas odorant mercaptan.
- Make sure your home has carbon monoxide and smoke detectors as well as fire extinguishers (or sprinklers).
- Check the temperature setting on the water heater. It should be set at 120 F (49 C).*
- Make sure outside natural gas equipment is free of snow and ice in inclement weather.
- Use portable grills outdoors only.
- Call 811 before digging in the yard.
